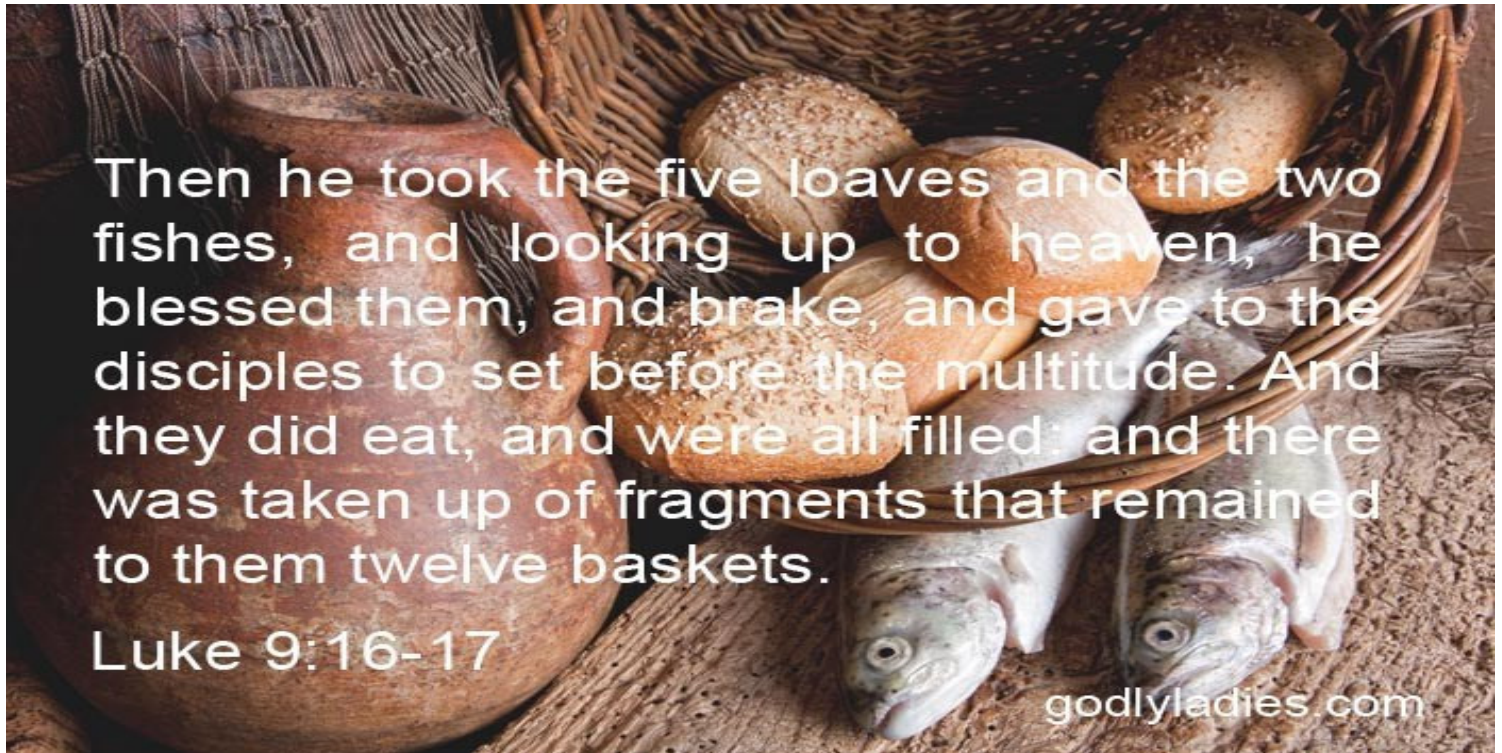

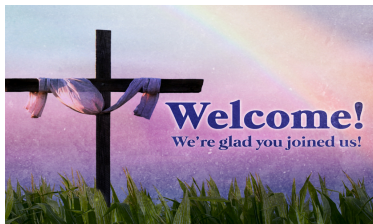

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Happy Corpus Christi!!!

Everyday when we celebrate the sacrifice of the Mass, we indeed celebrate 'Corpus Christi' the body and blood of Christ. However, on this day every year we are invited to take a closer look at this most unique manner of receiving Christ into our lives. This is the one unraveled way Jesus chooses to abide with his disciples – the sacrifice that becomes also his living presence among us.

As part of our celebration, like with some *other celebrations*, we will sing the *Sequence – Lauda Sion Salvatorem*. This moving and beautiful chant was composed by St. Thomas Aquinas, who is also referred to as the angelic doctor. I want to draw our attention to some verses of this song in magnificent praise of the Holy Eucharist for reflection:

"To-day there is given us a special theme of praise, the Bread both living and life-giving, which, it is not to be doubted, was given to the assembly of the brethren, twelve in number, at the table of the holy Supper.

"Let our praise be full and sounding; let the jubilations of the soul be joyous and becoming; for that solemn day is now being celebrated, on which is commemorated the first institution of this table.

"What Christ did at that Supper, the same He commanded to be done in remembrance of Him. Taught by His sacred precepts, we consecrate bread and wine into the Victim of salvation.

"By the recipient the whole (Christ) is received; He is neither cut, broken, nor divided.

One receives Him; a thousand receive Him: as much as the thousand receive, So much does the one receive; though eaten He is not diminished.

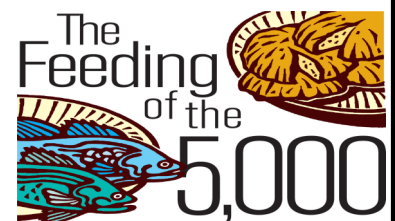
"The good receive Him, the bad receive Him, but with what unequal consequences of life or death. It is death to the unworthy, life to the worthy: behold then of a like reception, how unlike may be the result!

"When the Sacrament is broken, doubt not, but remember, that there is just as much hidden in a fragment, as there is in the whole. There is no division of the substance, only a breaking of the species takes place, by which neither the state nor stature of the substance signified is diminished."

May our participation in the Holy Eucharist renew the life of God in us. Amen.

FATHER AUGUSTUS TOLTON

Former African American slave, advances toward sainthood
 Vatican City, Jun 12, 2019 / 05:03 am (CNA).- Fr. Augustus Tolton advanced along the path to sainthood Wednesday, making the first black American slave-turned-priest one step closer to being the first black American saint. Pope Francis recognized the heroic virtue of Fr. Tolton June 12 making him "venerable" within the Church, only two steps away from canonization. With the decree, Catholics are now authorized to pray directly to Tolton as an intercessor before God.
