Dear Sisters and Brothers,

#### **Missionary Mandate**

While Jesus probably did not get a positive response from the three individuals mentioned in last Sunday's gospel, today's passage on the other hand confirms that many others did accept the invitation. They not only answered the call, but also had enough confidence reposed in them that, Jesus sends them out to preach in his name. That missionary mandate is given to each and every one of us.

The *Catechism* in the following paragraphs provides a little more on this enterprise:

"The Lord Jesus endowed his community with a structure that will remain until the Kingdom is fully achieved. Before all else there is the choice of the Twelve with Peter as their head. Representing the twelve tribes of Israel, they are the foundation stones of the new Jerusalem. The Twelve and the other disciples share in Christ's mission and his power, but also in his lot. By all his actions, Christ prepares and builds his Church. (*CCC*, 765)

""When the work which the Father gave the Son to do on earth was accomplished, the Holy Spirit was sent on the day of Pentecost in order that he might continually sanctify the Church." Then 'the Church was openly displayed to the crowds and the spread of the Gospel among the nations, through preaching, was begun. As the 'convocation' of all men for salvation, the Church in her very nature is missionary, sent by Christ to all the nations to make disciples of them. (CCC, 767)

"From the beginning, Jesus associated his disciples with his own life, revealed the mystery of the Kingdom to them, and gave them a share in his mission, joy, and sufferings. Jesus spoke of a still more intimate communion between him and those who would follow him: 'Abide in me, and I in you. .. I am the vine, you are the branches.' And he proclaimed a mysterious and real communion between his own body and ours: 'He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me, and I in him.' (CCC, 787)

"The minister should ask nothing for the administration of the sacraments beyond the offerings defined by the competent authority, always being careful that the needy are not deprived of the help of the sacraments because of their poverty.' The competent authority determines these 'offerings' in accordance with the principle that the Christian people ought to contribute to the support of the Church's ministers. 'The laborer deserves his food.'" (*CCC*, 2122)

Like the disciples, may we find joy in sharing God's word and our faith with others.




Below is the update for the parish on the 2019 Bishop's Annual Stewardship Appeal, captured through June 30, 2019.
