Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Spiritual Accountability

At the end of today's gospel, Jesus says, "Much will be required of the person entrusted with much, and still more will be demanded of the person entrusted with more." (Lk. 12:48) In this verse we have at least two things at play. One is how much God loves and values us to entrust to us all the spiritual blessings we have, and secondly, how important it is for us to be responsible in using them to glorify His name. Most of all, these gifts are to lead us to our eternal home.

Again we turn to the *Catechism* for some paragraphs on this theme:

"Everyone is called to enter the kingdom. First announced to the children of Israel, this messianic kingdom is intended to accept men of all nations. To enter it, one must first accept Jesus' word. The word of the Lord is compared to a seed which is sown in a field; those who hear it with faith and are numbered among the little flock of Christ have truly received the kingdom. Then, by its own power, the seed sprouts and grows until the harvest. (CCC, 543)

"Before his Ascension Christ affirmed that the hour had not yet come for the glorious establishment of the messianic kingdom awaited by Israel which, according to the prophets, was to bring all men the definitive order of justice, love and peace. According to the Lord, the present time is the time of the Spirit and of witness, but also a time still marked by 'distress' and the trial of evil which does not spare the Church and ushers in the struggles of the last days. It is a time of waiting and watching. (*CCC*, 672)


"Since the Ascension Christ's coming in glory has been imminent, even though 'it is not for you to know times or seasons which the Father has fixed by his own authority.' This eschatological coming could be accomplished at any moment, even if both it and the final trial that will precede it are "delayed". (*CCC*, 673)

"This Kingdom shines out before men in the word, in the works and in the presence of Christ.' To welcome Jesus' word is to welcome 'the Kingdom itself.' The seed and beginning of the Kingdom are the 'little flock' of those whom Jesus came to gather around him, the flock whose shepherd he is. They form Jesus' true family. To those whom he thus gathered around him, he taught a new 'way of acting' and a prayer of their own." (CCC, 764)

This new 'way of acting' calls for faithfulness and vigilance.


