Dear Brothers and Sisters.

#### **Avarice and Greed**

Today's gospel provides a window for us to touch on something that is part of our human psyche – our passions. The two individuals featured in the passage exemplify at least one result of unreasoned passion, one of the seven deadly sins as we traditionally refer to them – greed or avarice. I am sure we know the other six. The constant struggle of the Christian life is letting our reason and will control our passions and overcome vices.

The *Catechism* provides the following for us to keep in mind:

"The passions are natural components of the human psyche; they form the passageway and ensure the connection between the life of the senses and the life of the mind. Our Lord called man's heart the source from which the passions spring. (*CCC*, 1764)

"In themselves passions are neither good nor evil. They are morally qualified only to the extent that they effectively engage reason and will. Passions are said to be voluntary, 'either because they are commanded by the will or because the will does not place obstacles in their way.' It belongs to the perfection of the moral or human good that the passions be governed by reason." (CCC, 1767)

When we allow our passions to take over, the result is often a life of sin and vice as against one of virtue and righteousness.

"Vices can be classified according to the virtues they oppose, or also be linked to the *capital sins* which Christian experience has distinguished, following St. John Cassian and St. Gregory the Great. They are called 'capital' because they engender other sins, other vices. They are pride, avarice, envy, wrath, lust, gluttony, and sloth or acedia.(*CCC*, 1866)

"Because man is a *composite being, spirit and body*, there already exists a certain tension in him; a certain struggle of tendencies between 'spirit' and 'flesh' develops. But in fact this struggle belongs to the heritage of sin. It is a consequence of sin and at the same time a confirmation of it. It is part of the daily experience of the spiritual battle: 'For the Apostle it is not a matter of despising and condemning the body which with the spiritual soul constitutes man's nature and personal subjectivity. Rather, he is concerned with the morally *good or bad* works, or better, the permanent dispositions - virtues and vices - which are the fruit of *submission* (in the first case) or of *resistance* (in the second case) to *the saving action of the Holy Spirit*. For this reason the Apostle writes: "If we live by the Spirit, let us also walk by the Spirit."' (*CCC*, 2516)

In another passage, Jesus told his disciples, "What profit is there for one to gain the whole world and forfeit his life?" (Mk 8:36). Let us pray for the virtue of prudence and temperance.




