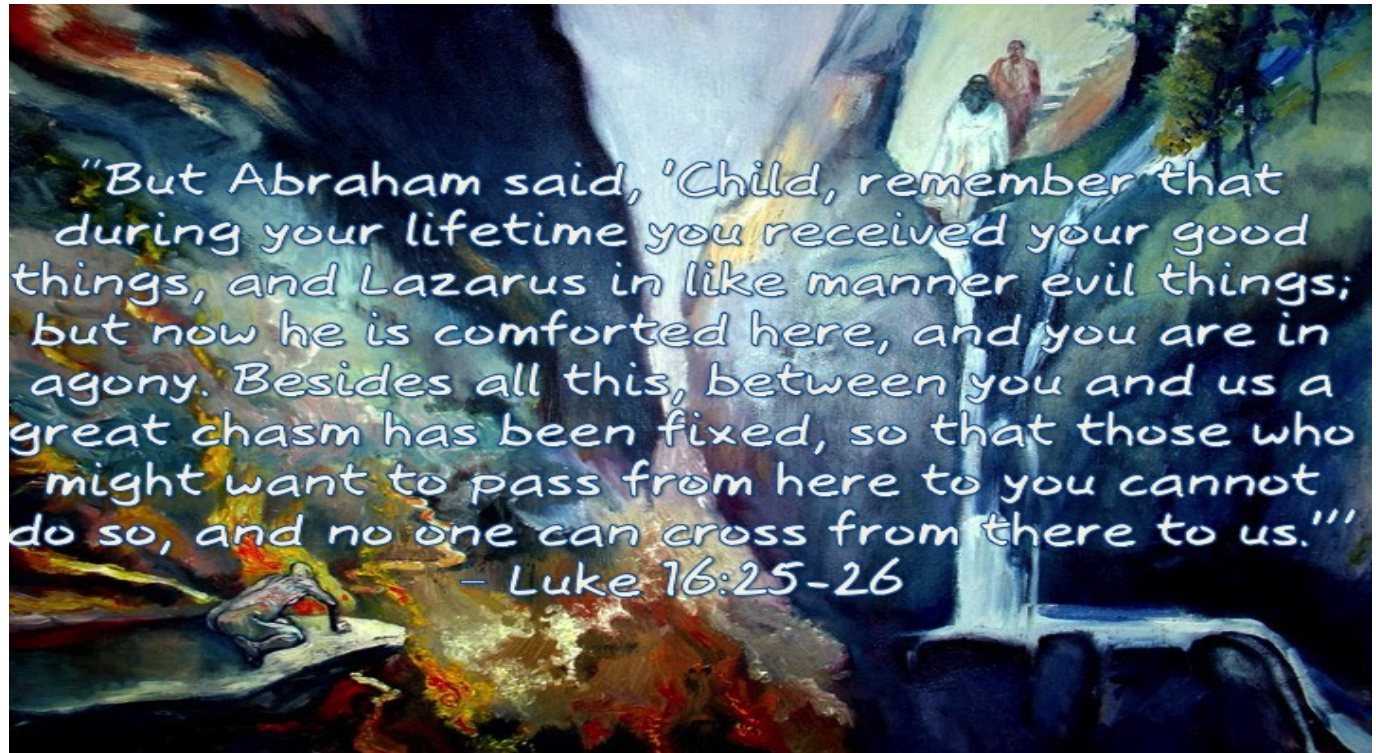

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Material Solidarity and Christianity

The story of Dives, the rich man and poor Lazarus puts before us in a unique way the never-changing material disparity between the very rich and wealthy on one hand and the very poor and destitute on the other. It has remained a source of concern for generations. And while a great deal has been achieved in changing the fortunes of millions of people around the globe, there is still plenty to do. As Christians, we are challenged to relieve the Lazarus's we encounter or hear about of their needs and wants. Meeting this challenge and being conscious of it is what solidarity entails, and nations and individuals have roles to play.

Here again are some paragraphs from the *Catechism* on this very important matter:

“But the presence of those who hunger because they lack bread opens up another profound meaning of this petition. The drama of hunger in the world calls Christians who pray sincerely to exercise responsibility toward their brethren, both in their personal behavior and in their solidarity with the human family. This petition of the Lord's Prayer cannot be isolated from the parables of the poor man Lazarus and of the Last Judgment. (CCC, 2831)

“An increased sense of God and increased self-awareness are fundamental to any full development of human society. This development multiplies material goods and puts them at the service of the person and his freedom. It reduces dire poverty and economic exploitation. It makes for growth in respect for cultural identities and openness to the transcendent. (CCC, 2441)

“It is not the role of the Pastors of the Church to intervene directly in the political structuring and organization of social life. This task is part of the vocation of the lay faithful, acting on their own initiative with their fellow citizens. Social action can assume various concrete forms. It should always have the common good in view and be in conformity with the message of the Gospel and the teaching of the Church. It is the role of the laity ‘to animate temporal realities with Christian commitment, by which they show that they are witnesses and agents of peace and justice.’ (CCC, 2442)

“Various causes of a religious, political, economic, and financial nature today give ‘the social question a worldwide dimension.’ There must be solidarity among nations which are already politically interdependent. It is even more essential when it is a question of dismantling the ‘perverse mechanisms’ that impede the development of the less advanced countries. In place of abusive if not usurious financial systems, iniquitous commercial relations among nations, and the arms race, there must be substituted a common effort to mobilize resources toward objectives of moral, cultural, and economic development, ‘redefining the priorities and hierarchies of values.’”(CCC, 2438)
