Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Priority and Letting Go

The strong language Jesus uses in today's gospel is one that can make for very uncomfortable reading. However, experience shows that, for earthly and human glory, we actually do exactly what he demands. When sports men and women go into camp to prepare for a tournament for weeks and months, that is exactly what often happens. St. Paul references such undertakings in 1 Corinthians 9:25. For the eternal destination, it cannot be different.

The *Catechism* reminds us: "Christ is the center of all Christian life. The bond with him takes precedence over all other bonds, familial or social. From the very beginning of the Church there have been men and women who have renounced the great good of marriage to follow the Lamb wherever he goes, to be intent on the things of the Lord, to seek to please him, and to go out to meet the Bride-groom who is coming. Christ himself has invited certain persons to follow him in this way of life, of which he remains the model: 'For there are eunuchs who have been so from birth, and there are eunuchs who have been made eunuchs by men, and there are eunuchs who have made themselves eunuchs for the sake of the kingdom of heaven. He who is able to receive this, let him receive it.'(*CCC*, 1618)

"Jesus enjoins his disciples to prefer him to everything and everyone, and bids them 'renounce all that [they have]' for his sake and that of the Gospel. Shortly before his passion he gave them the example of the poor widow of Jerusalem who, out of her poverty, gave all that she had to live on. The precept of detachment from riches is obligatory for entrance into the Kingdom of heaven."(*CCC*, 2544)

In the same context of preferring him to all others, Jesus not surprisingly talks also about the cross. Without the cross in any number of shapes and variety, there really is no enduring relationship with Jesus. Without the cross, we find ourselves in the realm of "cheap grace". According to Bonhoeffer, "cheap grace is the preaching of forgiveness without requiring repentance, baptism without church discipline. Communion without confession. Cheap grace is grace without discipleship, grace without the cross, grace without Jesus Christ."

Yes, salvation is ultimately free, but Jesus invites his followers, us, to bear our own crosses. That is how we prioritize our relationship with him over all others.

And speaking about crosses, most in the Bahamas will be dealing with them for months to come. We will be playing our part in assisting them to do so in a matter of weeks, and not only in prayers. So let us all keep this in mind and be appreciative of how fortunate we made out in Florida during the hurricane.
