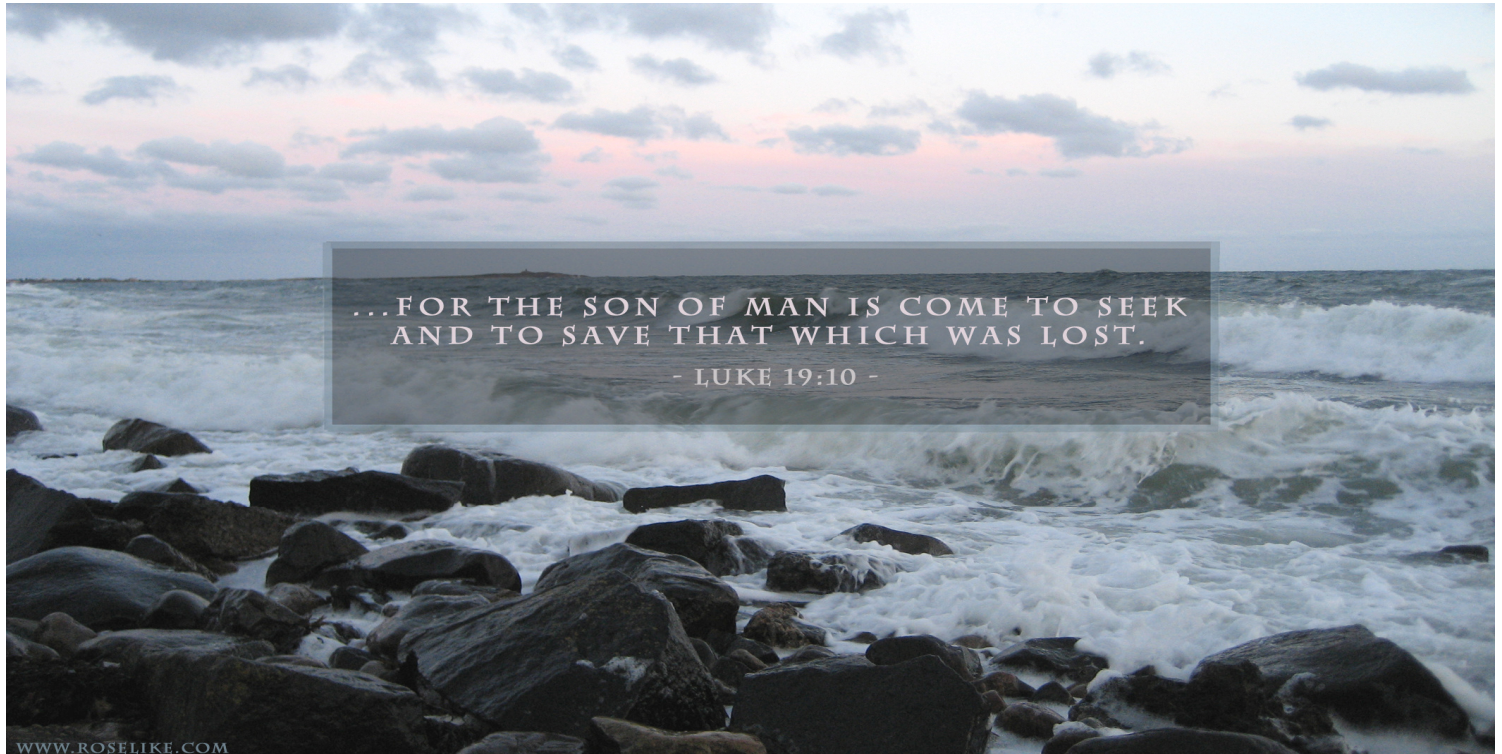

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

#### 'Home' Justification

Another Sunday, another tax collector, in fact, a much higher-ranked tax collector, but the ending is the same – justification in God's sight following contrition, repentance and God's mercy. "Today salvation has come to this house..." The repentance of Zacchaeus also comes with his commitment to make restitution or reparation in a spirit of justice.

In the *Catechism*, we find the following: "In virtue of commutative justice, *reparation for injustice* committed requires the restitution of stolen goods to their owner:

Jesus blesses Zacchaeus for his pledge: 'If I have defrauded anyone of anything, I restore it fourfold.' Those who, directly or indirectly, have taken possession of the goods of another, are obliged to make restitution of them, or to return the equivalent in kind or in money, if the goods have disappeared, as well as the profit or advantages their owner would have legitimately obtained from them. Likewise, all who in some manner have taken part in a theft or who have knowingly benefited from it – for example, those who ordered it, assisted in it, or received the stolen goods – are obliged to make restitution in proportion to their responsibility and to their share of what was stolen." (CCC, 2412)

The making of restitution also can apply to other nonmaterial hurts against our fellow human beings: "Many sins wrong our neighbor. One must do what is possible in order to repair the harm (e.g., return stolen goods, restore the reputation of someone slandered, pay compensation for injuries). Simple justice requires as much. But sin also injures and weakens the sinner himself, as well as his relationships with God and neighbor. Absolution takes away sin, but it does not remedy all the disorders sin has caused. Raised up from sin, the sinner must still recover his full spiritual health by doing something more to make amends for the sin: he must 'make satisfaction for' or 'expiate' his sins. This satisfaction is also called 'penance.'" (CCC, 1459)

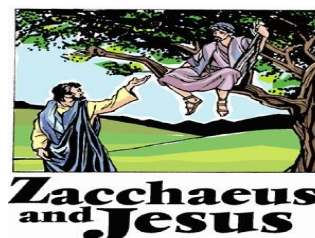
While the crowds were literally shocked at Jesus' interaction with Zacchaeus, he knew better about his internal disposition. Hence, "To avoid rash judgment, everyone should be careful to interpret insofar as possible his neighbor's thoughts, words, and deeds in a favorable way:

Every good Christian ought to be more ready to give a favorable interpretation to another's statement than to condemn it. But if he cannot do so, let him ask how the other understands it. And if the latter understands it badly, let the former correct him with love. If that does not suffice, let the Christian try all suitable ways to bring the other to a correct interpretation so that he may be saved." (CCC, 2478)

Like the tax collector at prayer in the temple, Zacchaeus is home justified, regardless of what the crowds might think.

**EL CAMINO DE SANTIAGO**

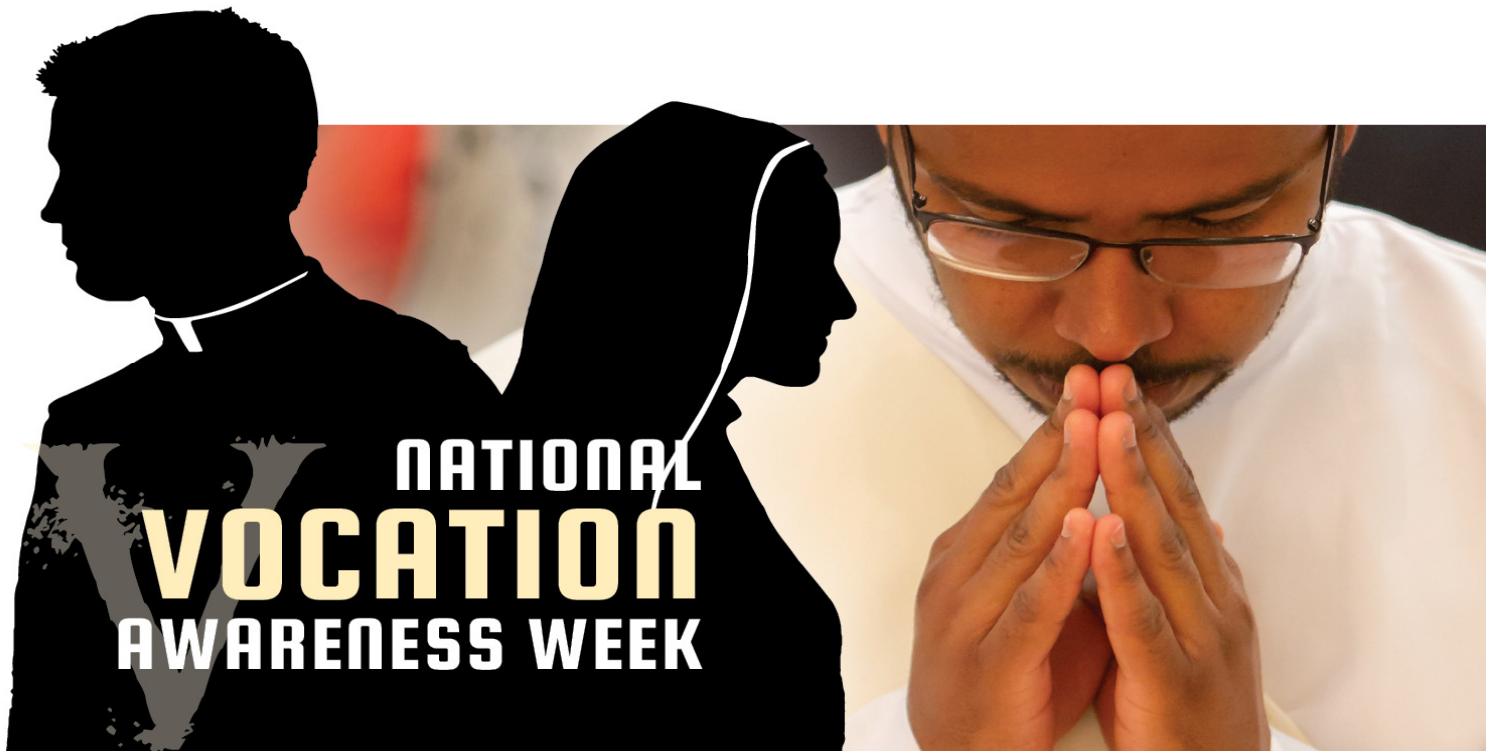
