Pastor's Easter Message

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

The Corona Virus and Parish Life 7 – Easter Season

If you have been keeping track of this space, you definitely notice that today's edition is number 7 since the series started. So lets go biblical for a moment. The number 7 in scripture represents perfection, completion. That number today brings good news for our faith community in the Diocese of St. Augustine.

But first let me wish all our mothers, grandmothers, great grandmothers, god-mothers and all those who have played motherly roles in our lives a **VERY HAPPY MOTHERS DAY**. Sadly, it is another black eye for the covid-19 virus; and one is unable to personally extend this wish as we have traditionally done. In the same way, many families may not be able to observe it as in the past. Yet, as we have done with many other aspects of life this period, sons and daughters will find novel ways to appreciate all mothers. May God the source of all life continue to bless all mothers, through whom we all received the gift of life. Amen.

Here is the good news. Over the past seven weeks, we have had to make do with participation in livestreamed masses and other services. Thankfully that is about to change. Beginning the weekend of May 16th and 17th, the Diocese is giving the go ahead for public masses and other liturgical celebrations and sacraments to go ahead. This move I am sure does not come as a surprise as we see things gradually reopening in different parts of the state and country.

Obviously, like other spaces opening up, the return to community worship is not right away going to be as we had it pre-CV19. Along with other organizations and establishments, our reopening will be taking into account all precautions necessary to keep everyone safe and healthy. By now, we all know what these precautions are and the need for everyone to play their role.

For our tri-parish, our reopening for now will be limited to one church building for reasons of size and accommodation in keeping with the physical distancing requirement. All weekend masses for now will be celebrated at Holy Rosary – vigil at 5pm, Sunday at 8.30am and 10.30am. Week day masses will begin on Tuesday May 19th. The schedule remains the same as we find it in our bulletin.

Before the 'lockdown', we had some precautions already in place; these remain in force: no holy water fonts; no physical sign of peace; Communion under one species, and Communion in the hand. As we reopen, please take note of the following additional guidelines: parishioners are advised to wear face masks or some face covering and be ready for physical distancing at all times during mass. The latter provision is not applicable to families and others who live in the same households. As we all know by now, all in vulnerable situations are asked to stay at home. One of the weekend masses will still be livestreamed. SEE MANY OF YOU SOON!!!

Tax Credit Scholarship and Family Empowerment Scholarship for lower-income families.


